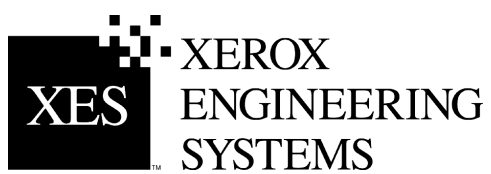

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## Welcome to the MAX 200

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Congratulations on acquiring your new MAX 200. Xerox Engineering Systems looks forward to supporting you and helping you increase your organizational productivity.

The MAX 200 is a high speed, highlight color production solution for centralized operations. It is a large-format digital copier for high-volume production producing 9.2 E-size, 17 D-size, 22 C-size, 29 B-size, and 37 A-size prints per minute, with concurrent scanning and printing operations.

### Maintenance safety

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1. Follow all warnings and instructions marked on or supplied with the product.
2. Unplug the units from the wall outlet before cleaning the exterior. Always use materials specifically designated for the MAX 200. Use of other materials may result in poor performance and could create a hazardous situation.
3. Do not use aerosol cleaners. Follow the instructions in this operator guide for the correct cleaning methods.
4. Never use supplies or cleaning materials for purposes other than what they were intended. Keep all supplies and materials out of the reach of children.
5. Do not use the units near water, wet locations, or outdoors.
6. The components of this product are equipped with a three-wire, grounding-type plug (i.e., a plug having a grounding pin). This plug will only fit into a grounding-type power outlet. This is a safety feature. To avoid the risk of electric shock, contact your electrician to replace the receptacle if you are unable to insert the plug into the outlet.
7. Never use a ground adapter plug to connect the system to a power source that lacks a ground connection terminal.
8. This system should be operated from the type of power source indicated on the marking label. If you are not sure of the type of power available, consult your local power company.
9. The power supply cord is the disconnect device for this equipment. Make sure that the installation is near the socket outlet and is easily accessible.

  - If the units are producing unusual noises or odors.
  - If the units or the cabinets have been damaged.

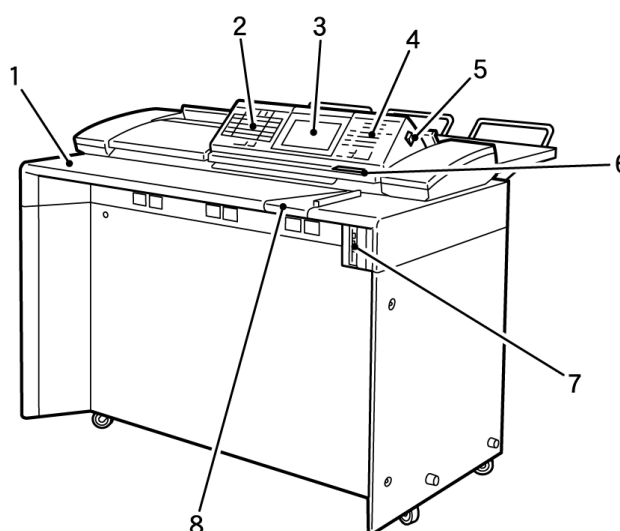
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## Scanner

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### Front

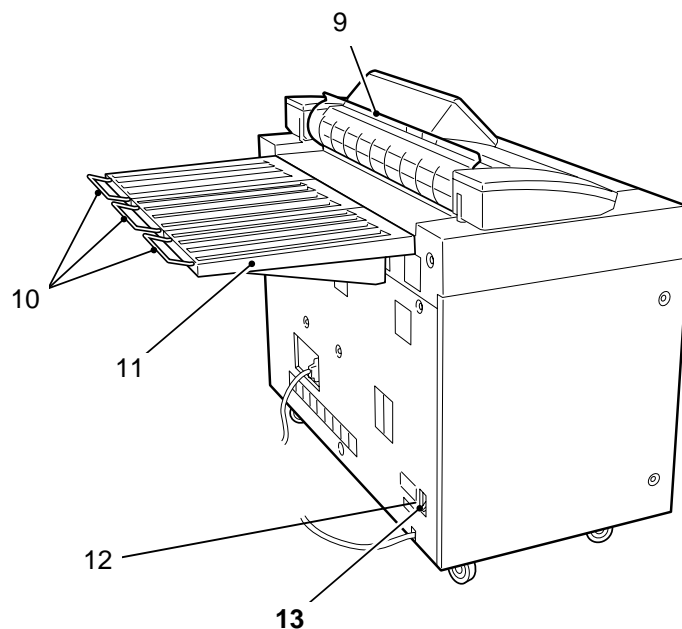
---



No.	Name	Function
1	<b>Document shelf</b>	Place documents face down on the document shelf and feed into the scanner.
2	<b>Auto mode panel</b>	The auto mode panel is used to select the media size, document feed direction, and mode of operation. When in auto mode the panel also displays the document size, media type, and media supply information. For detailed information about the panel, refer to page 29.
3	<b>Touch screen</b>	Displays available features and options, messages, and job information. For detailed information about the touch screens, refer to page 19.
4	<b>Scanner control panel</b>	Contains the numeric keypad, control buttons and the document counter. For detailed information about the panel, refer to page 21.
5	<b>Power switch</b>	Switches the scanner power-on or off. If your system is equipped with the printer and the scanner switch is positioned to off, power to the printer is also removed.
6	<b>Document feed direction panel</b>	Displays the document feed direction.
7	<b>Floppy diskette drive</b>	The floppy disk drive is used to store stamp data.
8	<b>Document guide</b>	The document guide registers the document during the scan process.

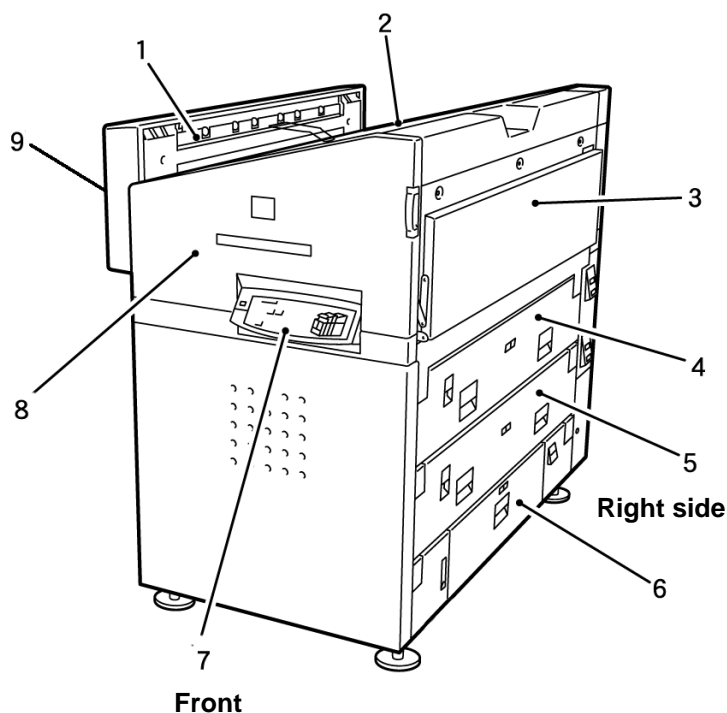

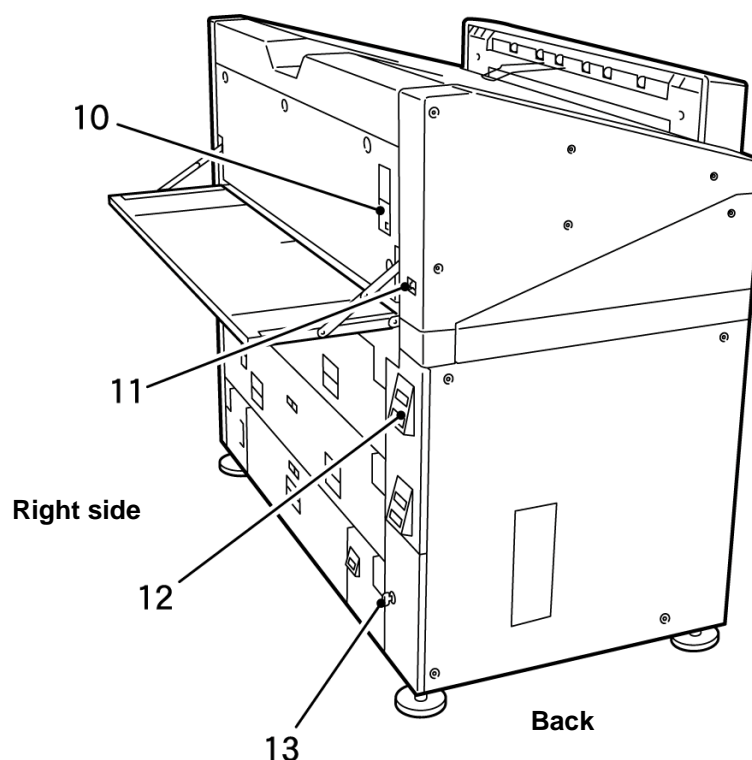
No.	Name	Function
9	<b>Document exit guide</b>	The document exit guide is positioned manually. If the guide is positioned up, documents are fed to the document output tray. If the guide is positioned down, documents are fed to the front of the scanner.
10	<b>Document support guides</b>	If documents are longer than 36 inches, pull out the document support guides. The guide keeps long documents from falling off the document output tray.
11	<b>Document output tray</b>	The document output tray receives documents when the document exit guide is in the up position.
12	<b>Scanner circuit breaker</b>	The circuit breaker switches the main power to the scanner on or off.
13	<b>Ground fault protector</b>	If the scanner detects an electrical problem, the ground fault protector switches the scanner power off.

No.	Name	Function
1	<b>Copy output tray exit area</b>	Copies that exit this area are feed to the copy output tray.
2	<b>Copy output tray</b>	Copies are placed onto the copy output tray when there is no folder or stacker. Maximum media tray capacity is 100 sheets (20 –24 lb.).
3	<b>Manual feed tray</b>	Supplies standard or nonstandard media sizes. All media is feed manually.
4	<b>RFC drawer 1</b>	The roll feed cutter (RFC drawer 1) supplies up to 2 rolls of media. The media type and series panel is included in the drawer, for detailed information about the panel, refer to page 38.
5	<b>RFC drawer 2</b>	The roll feed cutter (RFC drawer 2) supplies up to 2 rolls of media. The media type and series panel is included in the drawer, for detailed information about the panel, refer to page 38.
6	<b>Cut sheet tray</b>	Supplies 1000 sheets of cut sheet media, 8.5 x 11 inch to 12 x 18 inch. The cut sheet tray is also referred to as tray 5. The media series panel is included in the tray, for detail information about the panel, refer to page 38.
7	<b>Printer control panel</b>	Displays the printer status and includes the offline button, and the red and black increase toner buttons. For detailed information about the panel, refer to page 30.
8	<b>Front door</b>	Open to access media jams or to replace the toner cartridge.
9	<b>Copy output folder/stacker exit area</b>	Copies that exit this area and are fed into the folder or stacker.

No.	Name	Function
10	Manual feed panel	Displays the manual feed tray status and contains the manual feed control buttons. For detailed information about the panel, refer to page 34.
11	Power switch	Switches the printer power-on or off.
12	RFC panel	Displays media roll information. The trim button controls the auto cut function. For detailed information about the panel, refer to page 36.
13	Lower door	Open to access the printer circuit breaker, heater switch and the humidifier switch (optional).

### Manual feed tray

Using the manual feed tray is useful when the correct size or type of media is not loaded in the printer, or when you need to make a copy on special size media (A – E).

For detailed information on how to make copies, with the manual feed tray, refer to page 70.

# Touch screen

---

The touch screens contain messages, copy quantity information, tabs, buttons, icons and text. There are two types of screens, the copy feature screens and the custom presets screens.

The copy feature screens are grouped into four feature group tabs; basic, image quality, additional, and finishing. Whenever a selection is made from any of the tabs, the selection overrides the custom presets values until the **clear all** button is pressed.

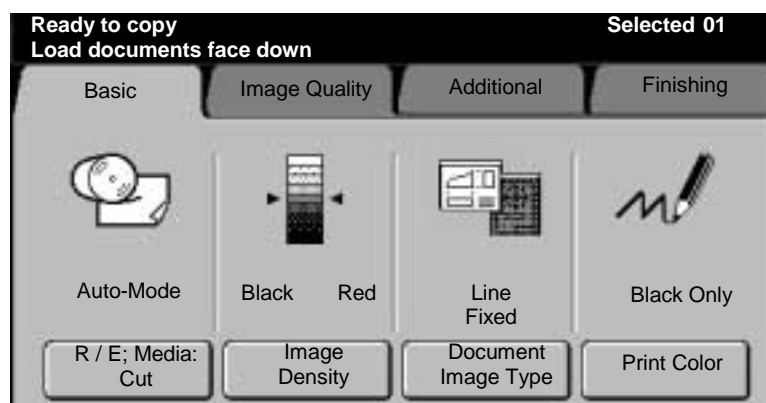
The custom presets screens are grouped into three feature group tabs; system, copy, and storage/disk manager. When you enter custom presets you can customize the MAX 200 defaults, to meet your workflow requirements.

## Components

---



*Note: The screen below is an example of a copy feature screen. The text above the selection buttons, displays the current copy feature selections.*



**Message bar** Displays the machine conditions, operator instructions, and copy quantity. In this example the message bar displays the following information:



**Tabs** There are four feature group tabs (basic, image quality, additional, finishing). When a tab is selected, the feature group menu is displayed. Each feature group has a specific set of selections.

**Icons and text** Each feature group screen is divided into columns, each column may contain an icon with text. Each column provides the operator a quick overview of the current job selections.

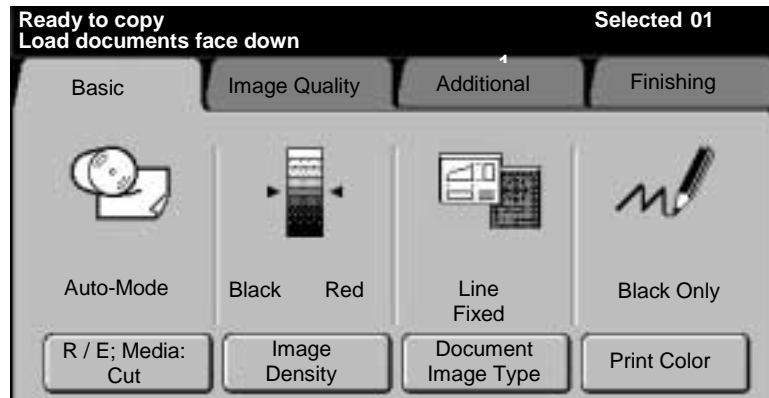
**Selection buttons** To select touch screen features or options, touch the desired button.

## Touch screen (continued)

### How do I know if a feature or option is available?

---



An available feature or option is shown raised and is not grayed out. In this example the basic feature group tab is available, along with the four selection buttons.

Any tab or button that is not raised and appears to be grayed out is not available. In this example the following tabs are not available: image quality, additional, and finishing.

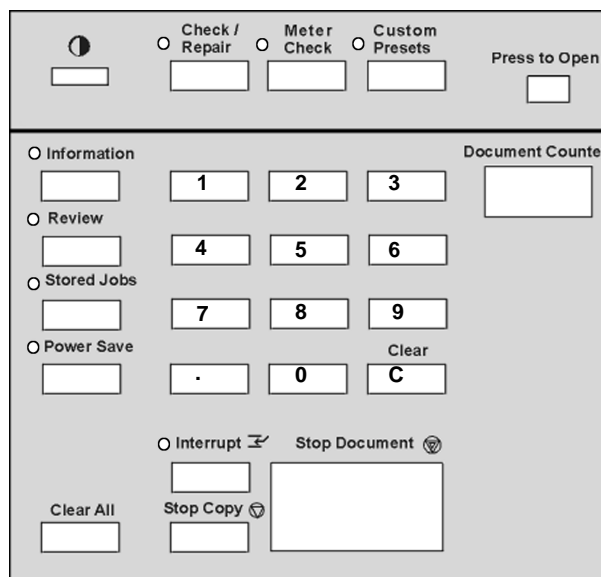


*Note: Any feature group tab or selection button that is not available, may have a conflict with a current selection. Sometimes a specific option must be selected first, or your machine is not equipped with the optional accessory.*

# Scanner control panel

## Upper components

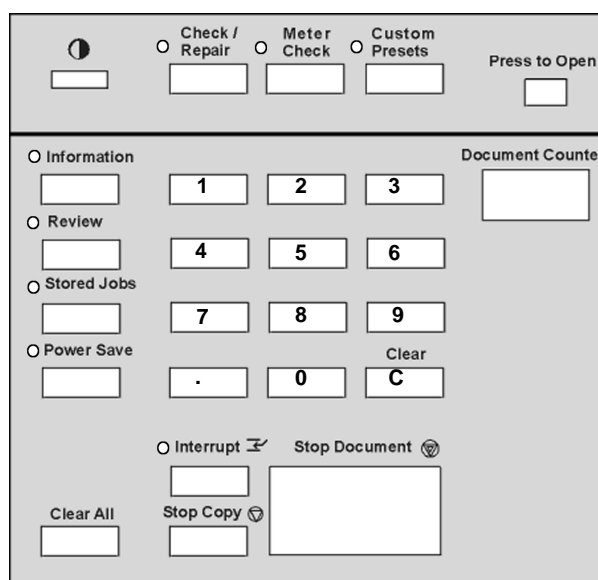
The **scanner control panel** is divided into two sections; the upper and lower sections. The upper section is located under the scanner control panel cover. To access the upper section, press the **press to open** latch and release.



Name	Function
<b>Brightness control dial</b>	The <b>brightness control dial</b> adjusts the brightness of the touch screen.
<b>Check/repair button</b>	The <b>check/repair button</b> is for the service representative.
<b>Meter check button</b>	The <b>meter check button</b> provides access to the billing meter. The meter reads the printer usage. For detailed information on how to use the meter check button, refer to page 24.
<b>Custom presets button</b>	The <b>custom presets button</b> provides access to the system, copy, and storage/disk manager defaults. You can change the defaults to meet your specific needs. For detailed information about the custom presets button, refer to page 24.
<b>Press to open latch</b>	Press and release the <b>press to open</b> latch, to open the top cover of the scanner control panel.

## Scanner control panel (continued)

### Lower components



Name	Function
<b>Information button</b>	Press the <b>information button</b> , to provided online information about the machine feature and options. For detailed information, refer to page 23.
<b>Review button</b>	Press the <b>review button</b> , to display the current job feature settings, and move quickly between screens. For detailed information, refer to page 25.
<b>Stored jobs button</b>	Press the <b>stored jobs button</b> to store, recall or delete a stored job. For detailed information, refer to page 162.
<b>Power save button</b>	Press the <b>power save button</b> , to enter or exit the power saver mode. For detailed information, refer to page 28.
<b>Document counter</b>	The <b>document counter</b> displays the total number of scanned documents. To reset, press the button beside the counter.
<b>Clear button</b>	Press the <b>clear (C) button</b> , to clear numeric data. For detailed information, refer to page 26.
<b>Clear all button</b>	Press the <b>clear all button</b> , to clear current copy feature selections and numeric data. The machine automatically returns to the custom presets default settings. For detailed information, refer to page 26.
<b>Interrupt button</b>	Press the <b>interrupt button</b> to suspend the current job, so a different job can be run. For detailed information, refer to page 27.
<b>Stop copy button</b>	Press the <b>stop copy button</b> to stop the print cycle. For detailed information, refer to page 27.
<b>Stop document button</b>	Press the <b>stop document button</b> to stop the scan operation. For detailed information, refer to page 25.
<b>Numeric keypad</b>	Press the <b>keypad buttons</b> to enter quantity and other information.



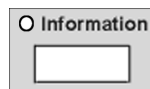

### Information button

---

#### Introduction



The **information button** is a quick way to access online information. For additional information, refer to the user guide.

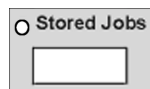
#### Procedure

1. Press the **information button**.  
The information indicator lamp is lit and the **information main-menu screen** is displayed.
2. Select the desired topic.  
Information about the topic is displayed or a sub topic menu is displayed.  
Select **close** to return to the previous screen.
3. To exit, press the **information button**.  
The **basic feature group screen** is displayed and the information indicator lamp is not lit.

### Stored jobs button

#### Introduction



This **stored jobs button** allows you to store (create), recall, or delete stored jobs. For detailed information refer to page 162.

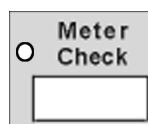
### Meter check button

---



*Note: The meter check screen displays two fields, billing and service. The service field is for the service representative.*

#### Introduction



The **meter check button** provides access to the billing meter. The meter displays the printer media usage.

The machine serial number is also displayed on the meter check screen. It is located at the lower right corner of the screen.

#### Procedure

1. Press the **press to open** latch, at the upper right corner of the scanner control panel cover.  
The scanner control panel cover is open.
2. Press the **meter check button**.  
The meter check indicator lamp is lit and the meter check screen is displayed.  
The billing field displays the media usage.
3. To exit, press the **meter check button**.  
The **basic feature group screen** is displayed.

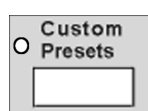
### Custom presets button

---



*Note: For detailed information on how to enter the custom presets feature, refer to page 174.*

#### Introduction



The **custom presets button** provides access to various default settings. There are three feature groups; system, copy and storage/disk manager.

#### Procedure

1. Press the **press to open latch**, at the upper right corner of the scanner control panel cover.  
The scanner control panel cover is open.
2. Ensure the machine is in copy mode. If needed, refer to page 277.
3. Press the **custom presets button**.  
The custom presets indicator lamp is lit and the system features tab is displayed.
4. Select the desired feature tab.
5. To exit, press the **custom presets button**.

## Scanner control panel (continued)

---

### Review button

---

#### Introduction



The **review button** provides quick access to review the current job features and quickly move between screens to make changes. Before printing your job, you may want to review all the selected features.

#### Procedure

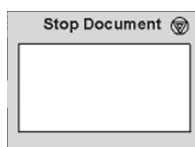
1. Press the **review button**.
  - The review indicator lamp is lit and the **review screen** is displayed. The first column of text, next to the feature button, is the name of the copy feature.
  - The second column of text, displays the selected feature option.
2. To make changes, select the desired copy feature button. The **copy feature screen** is displayed.
3. Enter your changes.
4. Perform one of the following:
  - a. If you do not have any more changes, select **done** on the copy feature screen. Continue to the next step.
  - b. If you need to make more feature changes press the **review button** again. The **review screen** is displayed and any feature button that is highlighted indicates a change has been made.

When all your changes are complete select **done** on the on the copy feature screen or select **close** on the **review screen** to save your changes. Continue to the next step.
5. Select the copy quantity.
6. Insert your document into the scanner.

### Stop document button

---

#### Introduction



Press the **stop document button** to stop the scan process. If a document begins to tear or skew, always press the **stop document button** immediately. Stopping the document may save your document and eliminate possible document jams.

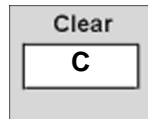

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### Clear button

---

#### Introduction

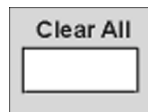


When the **clear (C) button** is pressed, the machine clears the numeric data entered from the keypad.

### Clear all button

---

#### Introduction



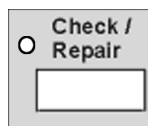
When the **clear all button** is pressed, the machine resets the copy features to the custom presets defaults. This occurs automatically after some preset amount of time.

If a jam occurs, press the **clear all button** to cancel the job while clearing the jam.

### Check/repair button

---

#### Introduction



The **check/repair button** is used by the service representative.

## Scanner control panel (continued)

---

### Stop copy button

---

#### Introduction



When the **stop copy button** is pressed, the printer stops printing. If the button is pressed during the copy cycle, the printer stops after completing the current copy cycle. You are given the option to continue the copy process or delete the image.

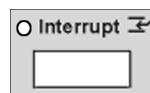
#### Procedure

1. Press the **stop copy** button.  
The **stop copy screen** is displayed.
2. Select **yes** to resume the same copy job (at the point where it was stopped) or select **no** to cancel the current job.

### Interrupt button

---

#### Introduction



Press the **interrupt button** when you need to run a job other than the current job that is printing and would like to return to the original print job without setting up the original job again.

#### Procedure

1. Press the **interrupt** button.  
When the current copy cycle is complete the **ready to copy** message is displayed. The interrupt indicator lamp stops flashing when the printer is ready to be programmed for the interrupt job.

# Image location

## Introduction

The **image location feature** shifts the image up, down or to the right in 1-mm increments up to 30 mm.

The image cannot be shifted to the left (the left arrow button is always disabled). If you copy requires a left margin, shift the image to the right.

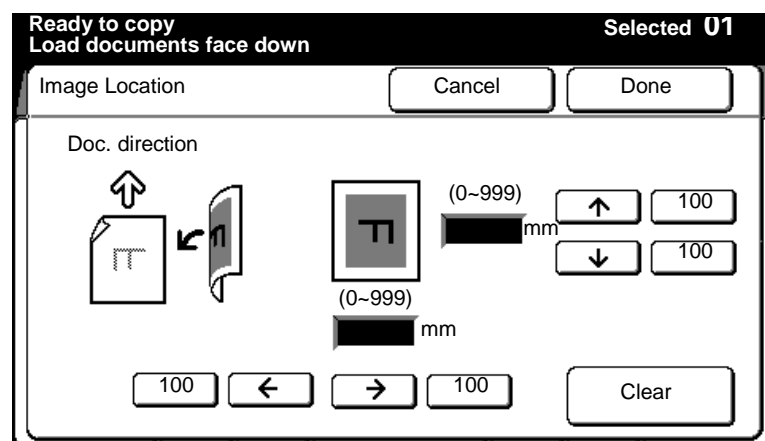

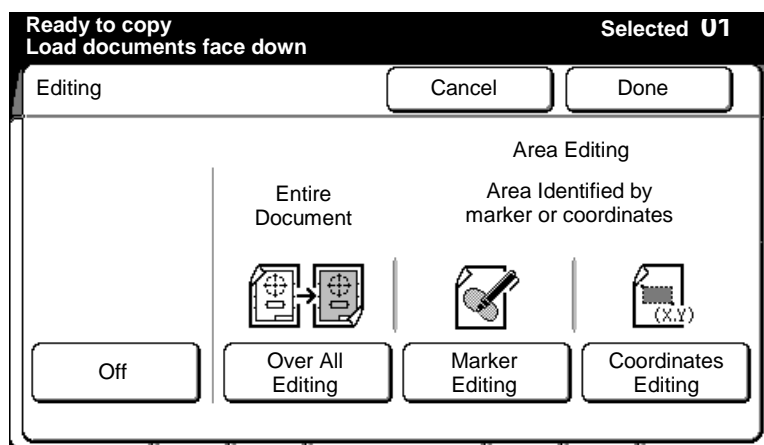

The MAX 200 provides two edit configurations; basic and full. When the optional editing kit is installed, your machine is equipped with the full configuration.

- If your machine is not equipped with the editing kit, the MAX 200 allows access to the **basic edit features only**. All basic edit features are identified with the word basic next to the feature.
- If your machine is equipped with the optional edit kit, the MAX 200 allows access to all edit features.

In order for the machine to recognize an area on your document, specify the area by marking your document with 4 dots (in rectangular form) or with closed area.

Once you have defined an area, you must apply the edit options to the inside or outside area of the marker. There are six marker edit options; trimming/masking, fill, contrast reversal, mirror image, color drop, and color exchange.

The method used to mark your document (4 dots or closed area) and the selection of inside or outside edit, determines the options that are available to you. Use the chart below as a quick reference to determine, if an option is available.



**Caution:** Choose your marker color carefully, especially when changing colors or brands. Xerox Engineering Systems recommends Bic Briteliner pink (BC11-PK), yellow (BC11-YL), or blue (BC11-BE) or equivalent.

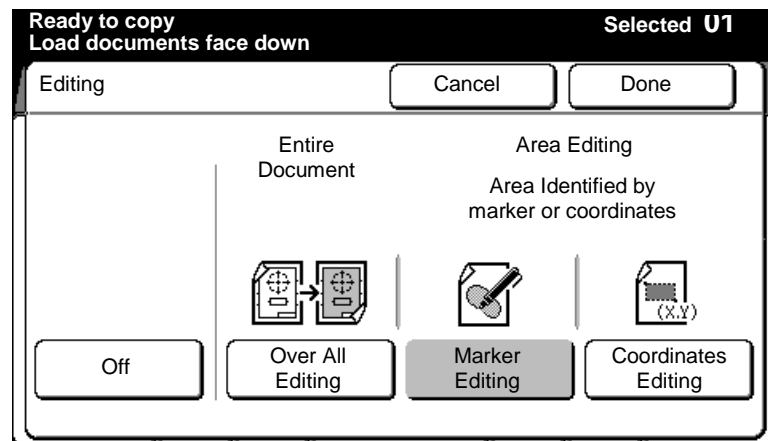

# E-sorter

## Introduction

The electronic sorter, also known as the E-sorter, reads a set of scanned documents, stores the data into memory, and delivers the desired quantity of sets to the printer.

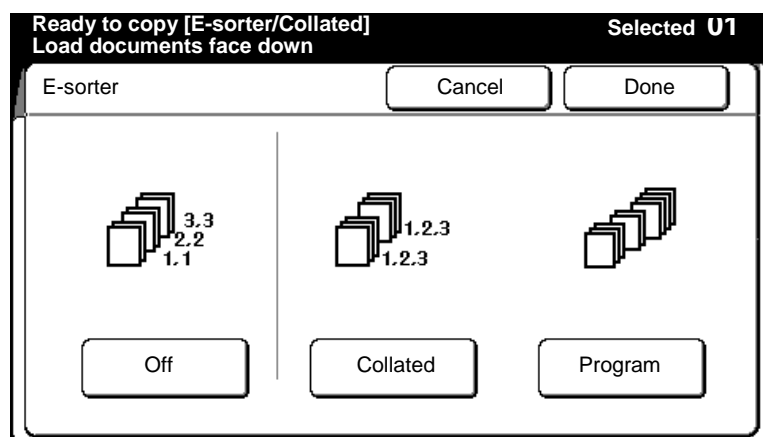
**Collated** copies print in sets, with a 1-2-3, 1-2-3, 1-2-3 order. When the **collated feature is off**, copies print in sets with a 1-1-1, 2-2-2, 3-3-3 order. You can select up to 99 copy sets.

The E-sorter also provides the **program feature**. The program feature is a convenient tool that helps you automate the copy function for jobs that have complex distribution lists.

The MAX 200 allows a maximum of 300 programs. Each program can store copy quantity requirements for up to 40 customers.

Once your E-sorter program is setup in custom presets, you can select the E-sorter **program button** to automate your copy jobs. For detailed information on how to setup an E-sorter program, refer to page 249.

# Stamper



*Note: If your machine is not equipped with the optional stamper, the stamper features is not available.*

## Introduction



This **stamper feature** allows you to select a stamp pattern to print, modify a stamp pattern, print the stamp patterns, or delete stamp patterns.

If you modify a stamp pattern, you are able to define the stamp location and orientation or include the date stamp and the numbering stamp. All stamp patterns are first created in custom presets before they can be modified, for detailed information on how to create the stamp, refer to page 234.

You may position a stamp anywhere on your copies, but patterns may not be larger than 70 mm squared = 4900 mm<sup>2</sup>. The stamp image can be printed red or black.

All created stamp patterns must be stored onto the floppy disk drive. The disk may contain up to 40 stamps; you can store additional stamps on other diskettes and load them as needed. Once stored onto the floppy you can load the stamp patterns into machine memory.



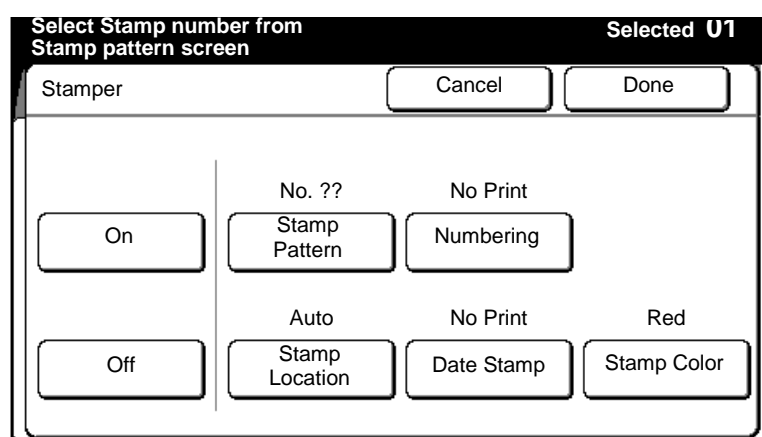

It is a good idea to keep a catalog of your stored jobs and their feature settings. There are two logs and the end of this chapter; **Stored jobs log** and **Job feature log**.

The first of two folds, it is always perpendicular to the copy length as the media travels through the printer. Package exits out the front of the machine.



#### Second fold

The second of two folds, it is always parallel to the copy length as the media travels through the printer.

#### Finishing

This feature is available when the fold can be altered by 5mm bigger or smaller.

#### Output processing

This feature is available when your folder can do special stacking after folding to separate the copies of the same set. When alternate is selected, the folder rotates every other set or offsets every other set. This feature can not be used to instruct the folder to insert banner pages.



*Note: Output processing can be selected with E-Sorter.*

#### Binding margin

This feature is available when the fold offers a binding margin. Dependent on the fold selection the binding margin value can be set to off or to 0, 20, 25, 30, or 50 mm.



*Note: Some folds may only enable only some of these sizes.*

#### Tab & reinforce

This feature is available when the fold can add binding holes to the output either by punching the holes or by adding an adhesive tab.

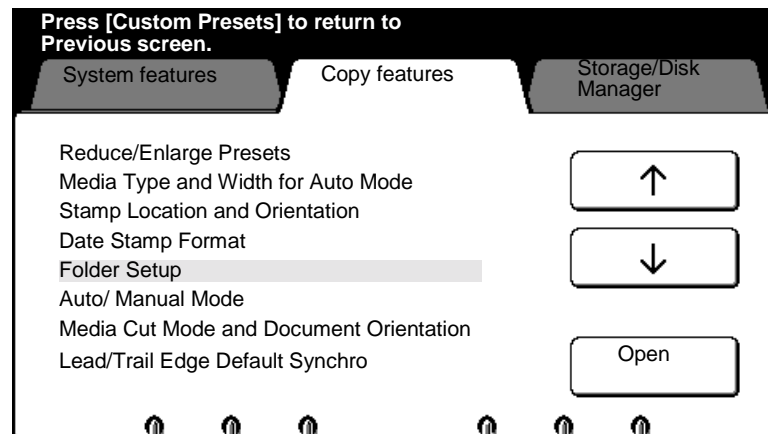

Lets imagine the red edit marker that you are using is not being recognized. Look at the current red marker setting, it is set to 50 - 70. This setting only covers the higher end of red on the color wheel. The marker you are using has a lot of orange and yellow in it.

#### Solution:

Therefore, you will need to change the color range to include orange and yellow recognition. Change the first number in the range to 0. When the new range is set to 0 - 70, the machine looks for red that contains yellow and orange.

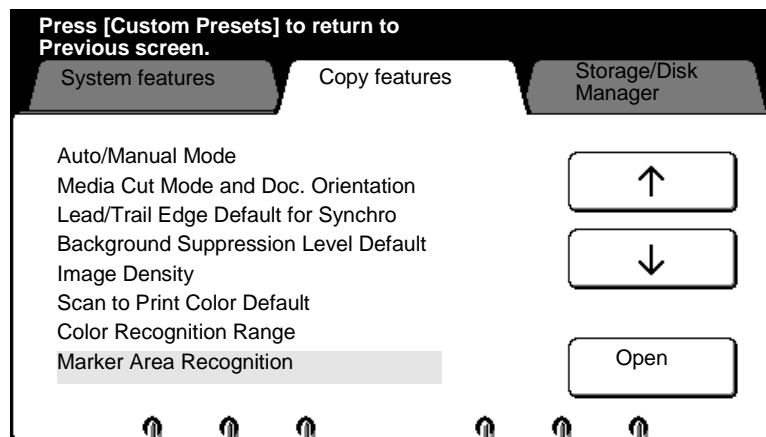

#### Introduction



With the MAX 200, a stamp pattern is created and then stored on a floppy disk. You later program the machine to add the stamp to each copy made.

In this section, you will learn how to setup the location parameters to scan the image, and then store the image. Once the image is stored it is referred to, as the stamp pattern.

The example at the far left corner has combined a scanned image (the X), the date stamp (9.16.95), and the numbering stamp (PRELIMINARY). The dotted line represents the total stamp pattern area.

Each feature can be used by itself, or combined with the other stamp features to meet your design requirements. The procedure to create a stamp is divided into four sets of measurements:

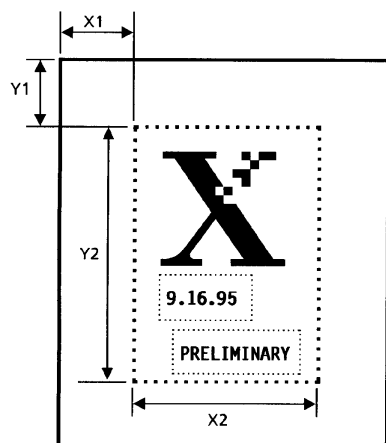
- The **first set of measurements** defines the starting position of the stamp pattern.
- The **second set of measurements** sets the stamp pattern width and height.
- The **third set of measurements** positions the date stamp feature.
- The **fourth set of measurements** positions the number stamp feature.

#### Procedure:



#### First set of measurements:

The first step is the stamp pattern design. The stamp pattern shown to the left has a scanned image (the X), and date (9.16.95), and numbering (PRELIMINARY).

Once the stamp has been designed, it is necessary to make several sets of measurements. These measurements are entered on the stamp create/store screen (custom presets). These sets of measurements are used by the scanner to create the stamp.



*Note: If you are going to include the date stamp and or the numbering stamp, ensure to include enough room for these features.*

The first set of measurements tells the scanner where to begin scanning. These measurements are called the **start position** X and Y coordinates.

**X1** Distance from the left edge of the paper to the left edge of the stamp pattern.

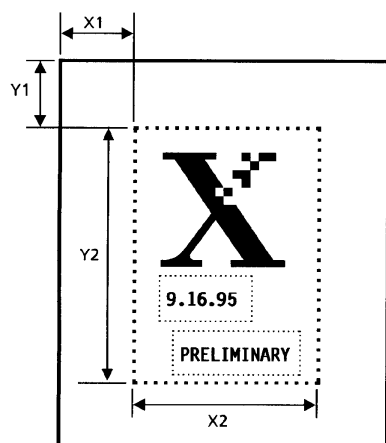
**Y1** Distance from the top edge of the paper to the top edge of the stamp pattern.

#### Second set of measurements:

The second set of measurements tells the scanner height and width of the stamp pattern. These measurements are called the **end position** X and Y coordinates.

**X2** The width of the stamp pattern.

**Y2** The height of the stamp pattern.

The **E-sorter program settings feature** allows you to setup, modify, or delete an E-sorter program. The MAX 200 can store a maximum of 300 programs, into memory. Each program can have a maximum of 40 customers.

Lets say you have a set of drawings, one electrical, one plumbing, and one mechanical and you have four different customers. The **E-sorter program setting feature** allows you to print as many copies of each document to each customer.

The chart below is setup for program number 1. As you can see, this is a convenient tool for users to automate the copy function for jobs that have a complex distribution list.

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### Cleaning the scanner platen glass

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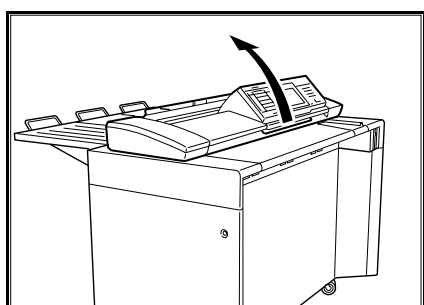
To avoid image quality problems, clean the platen glass on the scanner periodically. Dirt on the platen glass or the white platen roll may cause dark streaks along the entire copy length.

Use the following procedure if dark streaks appear on copies due to dirt build-up, on the platen glass or white platen roll.

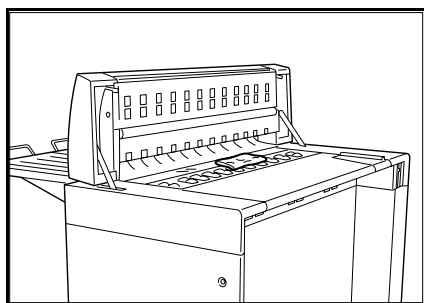


*Note: Do not use abrasive glass cleaner or solvents on the scanner platen glass.*

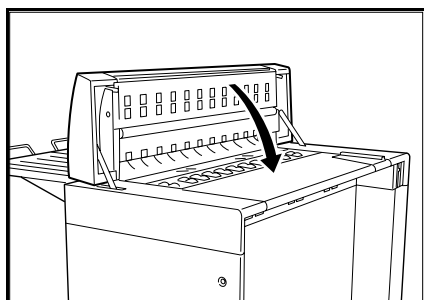

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## Problem solving

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This chapter identifies some machine problems that may occur, the recommended solutions, and information on how to clear document and media jams.

Use the information in this chapter to assist you with a machine problem when they occur. If needed, also refer to the network controller server manual.

Should you be unable to resolve a problem, place a call to your Xerox Engineering Systems representative.



*Note: This problem solving section only lists problems for the scanner and printer. If your machine is equipped with the optional folder or stacker, refer to their user guide for any problems.*

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## Problem solving chart

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This section lists various printer or scanner problems, that may occur and the suggested solution for each problem.

Problems	Suggested solutions
There are no indicators or messages displayed on the scanner control panel.	Ensure that the circuit breaker is switched on. Call for electrical assistance to ensure power is at the scanner or printer control panels.  Ensure that the scanner is plugged in.  Use the brightness control dial and adjust the display contrast.  Ensure that the ground fault protectors have not been activated. For detailed information about MAX 200 power, refer to page 41.
The <b>ready to copy</b> message is not displayed.	Resolve any error messages that are displayed.
Documents cannot be fed into the machine.	Follow the messages on the display.
Copies have black streaks or spots.	Clean the scanner platen glass with a moisten cloth if necessary.  Clean the white platen roll with a soft dry cloth if necessary.  For detailed information on how to clean the scanner platen glass, refer to page 256.
Copies are contaminated (excess toner).	Adjust the image density.  Check the condition of your document. Adjust the background suppression.

The **scanner interface feature** is an optional feature, it allows you to scan your documents and send them to a host workstation.

Use the following procedure to scan your documents. For detailed information on how to use the plotter software, refer to the plotter software user guide.

2. After a short wait, the scanner interface screen is displayed.
3. Insert the document to be scanned when the **ready to scan** message is displayed.

## Plotter interface (optional)

### Overview

The **plotter interface feature** is optional. It allows you to send a document from a host workstation to the scanner, which is then immediately printed.

You also have the option to make copies from the scanner (copy mode). When the plotter interface is installed, the machine always defaults to plot mode. In order to make copies from the scanner (copy mode), the MAX 200 must be in copy mode. For detailed information on how to enter copy mode, refer to page 277.
